Multipyling Disciple Makers





IN PURSUIT OF 199 VILLAGES

Pastor Francis was born in Sierra Leone, a West African country that was plagued by a civil war in the 1990s and an Ebola epidemic recently. Although 77 percent of the population is Muslim, according to the State.org website, the Christian faith is legal, thus giving iTEE Global the opportunity to interact and train Pastor Francis.

Francis's own life story is one of amazing grace. He grew up in a Muslim family that was connected to witch doctors. But Francis was drawn to Christian churches. As a child, he would

go to the mosque and attend church services. He became very interested to know Jesus. On March 27, 2010, he encountered the Lord's clear message of hope while at an outdoor revival. He then gave his life to Christ. He was with his friends. They were baptized and received Bibles. And his life was never the same.

In 2012, Francis began teaching Sunday School. With the help of a friend, he attended Bible College in Freetown, the capital city, and graduated with a diploma in Theology. More doors were opening for ministry. He was asked to teach a Bible study at one village when one of his friends declined the request and passed it on to him. Francis stepped in and started the Evangelism Movement. It was a self-funded endeavor. Soon another village was added on his map for ministry. Then he got involved in many more villages.

In 2016, Francis made a list of 199 remote villages where he wanted to preach the gospel, strengthen established churches, and plant new churches. In the years that followed, he lamented only being able to reach 69 of these villages. He continues to pursue the 199 villages to this day.



Francis is a young pastor, and needs more training in pastoral ministry, and in multiplying disciple-makers.

In 2021, iTEE Global connected with Francis. He was able to begin virtual classes in 2021. Through courses like the Gospel of Mark, he learned about the need to multiply disciple-makers. Francis wants to continue to preach the gospel in remote villages; this is not easy. He also wants to disciple new converts in these locations; and that is almost impossible. To reach many of these villages, Francis must walk several miles while carrying the materials. Then he has to navigate through communication barriers

The official language in Sierra Leone is English, but there are 18 different languages spoken in these 199 villages. In remote locations, there is no electricity, nor any cell phone reception. The illiteracy rate is very high, posing another challenge that Francis has to face. With all these obstacles, he was discouraged and realized how hard it is to multiply disciple-makers.

According to Barna research, only 28 percent of U.S. Christians try to disciple anyone, even with the many resources available.

ALL THINGS ARE POSSIBLE!

After prayer and brainstorming to find solutions to help Francis, a key idea surfaced that had already been used by iTEE University with students with visual impairments. It could be possible for iTEE Global to provide voice recorded lessons. Class recordings and passages of Scripture can be placed on micro-SD cards or shared as files through apps.

In future trips, Francis should be able to walk into villages with a backpack full of these micro-SD cards. Francis will still need financial support and guidance in his pursuit to reach the 199 villages; but what a joy it is to be involved and for iTEE Global to work with him! Thank you, Lord!

the AD2000 and Beyond Movement. For 13 years, Debbie served as a teacher with Biblical Education by Extension (BEE) World. She trained students in locations like Myanmar, Ukraine, and China.

In 2015, after graduating with an MS in Education from the University of Hull in England, Debbie began serving full time with Internet Theological Education by Extension (iTEE) Global. Her major roles were as a Global Trainer, Facilitator, Curriculum Writer, and in Cross-Cultural Training.

UNUSUAL HEALTH CHALLENGES

In July 2018, everything stopped. Debbie was diagnosed with a large leiomyo-sarcoma (LMS) with spread throughout her body. Doctors told her that she did not have much time left to live. Debbie was at peace because her confidence has always been in God; and if she were to die, she would see Jesus.

Much prayer and encouragement were coming her way. After several biopsies, they found that the distant cancer was a slow-moving thyroid cancer. Through surgery, the sarcoma tumor was successfully removed and the thyroid cancer treated by radiation. She returned to traveling and teaching in Africa and India.

VICTORY OVER DEATH

A year later, the sarcoma cancer started spreading, so Debbie has had regular scans, surgeries and treatments. She is still traveling and training others, though, trusting God for strength. God promised in 2 Corinthians 12:9 (NIV), "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Debbie understands that the cancer could overwhelm her body at any point... But her joy shines brightly. Her life shows how one can live moment by moment, trusting God completely. This is a season of joy for her. She can verbalize how crises are opportunities to know God better. She prays and encourages people like Pastor Francis of Sierra Leone.

FOUNDATIONS OF CHRISTIAN MARRIAGE

The Foundations of Christian Marriage Course is one of the courses of iTEE University. The principles of marriage rely much on character and love. Recently, one of the students, though a pastor, put nothing. When asked why, he explained that 20 years earlier, he had paid a dowry for his wife. He said he loved his children, but no love existed between him and his wife. He saw his wife as part of

his property. A facilitator directed him to Ephesians 5:25 (NIV): "Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her." She explained the importance of this passage of Scripture and challenged his thinking. The transformation that followed in this man was incredible. He began to live this Scripture with his wife and now is teaching other men in his church and village to love their wives. For the first time he truly was learning to love his wife.
