 harvest.”*



Stay-at-Home Parents

The Great Commission encourages us to go and make disciples of all nations. However, at various stages of our lives, we may be unable to go. As a young mother, Beverly Dewit prayed, asking the Lord where He would have her serve. The Lord told her to raise her children for Him, and He had more for her to do when her children were older.



Beverly taught her children to love and serve the Lord and equipped them for ministry. Her first mission trip to India with iTEE Global didn't come until her youngest daughter was in university. However, she had begun doing mission work from her home as a global facilitator and trainer, starting in 2021. Using the internet, she taught courses for students in over 18 countries, including Foundations in Christian Marriage, The Gospel of Mark, Galatians, Discovering the Bible, and Transformational Teaching.



Beverly is currently serving as iTEE Global's Communications Director while continuing to facilitate online courses.

Other stay-at-home parents, including our Asia Director, Rob Brooks, have homeschooled their children while working for iTEE Global. Another work-from-home mother served as an accountant for iTEE Global.

Seniors

Are you nearing retirement or retired and looking to continue serving the Lord? If so, iTEE Global Missions might have a place for you. Here are some examples of seniors contributing mightily to the Kingdom through iTEE Global's ministry. Tom Wood, the Human Resources Director at iTEE and a senior himself, mentioned that senior staff members manage half of the ministry.

Carol Nevin is in her eighties and is known as iTEE's CEO -- Chief Encouragement Officer. She recently travelled to Lusaka, Zambia, with a team to conduct an iTEE Global workshop for English-speaking pastors and church leaders. The facilitators led group discussions and activities to teach attendees how to apply what they learned and then share it with others. iTEE Global provides this kind of in-person seminar training to pastors and church leaders in rural areas who would otherwise lack access to it.



Ken Hall previously served as the African Ministry Director at iTEE. He now focuses on desktop publishing (DTP), converting our online courses into print format and workbooks for use in in-person teaching and training worldwide. This DTP initiative began last year due to the increasing demand for printed materials, where online training is not feasible or preferred. Ken has completed draft versions of "One to One" (English) and "Galatians," which will soon undergo review.



Les Fox joined iTEE Global at its inception in 2014. His passion is to make Christian disciples worldwide. Les served in the Navy and ministered to service members with the Navigators. He served as a pastor for more than twenty years and later spent over a decade as a missionary with Source of Light Ministry. As a facilitator with iTEE Global, he has led both in-person and online classes, including traveling to India and Africa to teach the Project Nehemiah Workshop.



Sometimes senior adults wonder how they can contribute to God's Kingdom in later years, but there are so many opportunities to serve Him! Our time on earth is short, and God is faithful to reward everything we do in His name, no matter what age we are.

Young Adults

Training young people to deliver face-to-face instruction abroad builds personal connections and amplifies the impact of our work.



Ministering with Disabilities

Ever since its founding, iTEE Global has opened doors of ministry to people with various forms of limitations and challenges, giving accessibility to both providers and recipients of this global ministry. Here are a few examples.



Though legally blind, Tom Wood is the Director of Human Resources. He recruits, interviews, and helps new staff find their place of ministry with iTEE Global.

Despite being homebound and in a wheelchair because of nerve damage from Multiple Sclerosis, Kevin Avery plays a key role in iTEE Global's prayer summits. Also, supporting both current and former iTEE University students, praying with them and encouraging them as they minister across the nations.



Though totally blind, Ben Watson serves as a class facilitator, course writer and team lead to ensure that iTEE Global courses are accessible and usable for all our students.

Ray Zulu, a blind pastor in Zambia, has successfully completed all courses for a certificate in Christian ministry. Ray says that iTEE University is the only school that has given him an opportunity to prepare himself for Christian ministry. Ray currently pastors a church in Kabwe, Zambia.

He has also used his extensive business experience to assist the leadership team with strategic planning.
