Why Are We Asking for More Staff?

We are making this appeal because God is opening doors faster than we can walk through them.

Over the past several months, members of our team have traveled on discovery trips to identify new opportunities for theological training, particularly in regions of the Muslim world where access to biblical education is extremely limited. At the same time, pastors and ministry leaders are finding iTEE Global through recommendations and word of mouth and are contacting us, asking for help in equipping their churches.

This is a wonderful challenge to have. The harvest is growing, but our current team simply cannot respond to every invitation or opportunity. We need more people who are willing to serve so that these open doors do not remain unanswered.

One staff member recently reflected on a discovery trip:

“The number of contacts I was given on this introductory trip was truly an answer to prayer. It was almost unbelievable, especially since this was my first visit. Many of these connections only came about after I

arrived, and they were clear provisions from God. I continue to be amazed at His graciousness throughout this journey.”

“We must continue to pray that God will sustain these relationships and open even more doors for future ministry. The pastors I met are godly, experienced leaders who have extensive ministry networks throughout Asia. They are eager to receive training and to share it with others.”

“The opportunities to provide courses are tremendous. Our greatest challenge now is having enough people—and enough translated resources—to meet the growing demand.”

This experience is not unique. Across multiple countries, we are seeing God prepare hearts and open doors for ministry. The opportunities before us are greater than ever before, and we are praying that God will raise up additional staff, translators, facilitators, and ministry partners who will help us respond to His call.

Perhaps God is calling you or someone you know to be part of this work.





John – Emerging Leader and Cross-Cultural Disciple-Maker

When John joined iTEE University in Kenya, he was single, recently graduated with a degree in Civil Engineering, and stepping into adulthood during a season of transition. iTEE University helped him realize something foundational: “Ministry is central in what you do,” he says. “It is not a by-the-way thing.” His faith shifted from passive participation to active engagement. “I moved from passive Christianity. Now I participate in bringing God’s Kingdom to earth—regardless of the career I take.”

After graduating from iTEE University, John moved to North Africa to pursue a master’s degree in Environmental Engineering. But the ministry did not pause. He

began with a small Bible study of three people studying the Galatians course in North Africa. They completed the course. The group expanded. Today, ten people—both Kenyans and North Africans—are studying the Romans course together. John teaches from North Africa via Zoom.

Even more remarkable is the multiplication happening back in Kenya. Young leaders he previously mentored now serve as teaching assistants. One young man, Mike, sought clarification during a study session and has since grown into a capable Bible teacher himself. Another leader organizes meetings, designs promotional materials, records sessions, and uploads

content to his YouTube channel. “It feels like 2 Timothy 2:2,” John says—entrusting truth to faithful people who will teach others also.

Behind the visible growth is spiritual formation. He explains, “All the courses emphasized application: what does this mean for me?” His spiritual disciplines grew stronger, and so did his burden to teach people how to interpret Scripture properly. He says, “That’s my passion—to help young people interpret the Bible well.”

From three students to ten; from in-person meetings to digital discipleship; one trained leader is already impacting two nations.

Ministry Opportunities

Translation Manager

The Translation Manager (TM) works primarily with each language translator team to help provide them with the resources they need to effectively, and efficiently, do their work of translating course materials. The TM coordinates activities of each translation team that includes: translators/translation company, editors, graphic artists, and course publishers for the smooth translation of courses for iTEE Global. The TM will work with iTEE Global leadership to establish priorities and to provide an accurate status of translation efforts.

Course Publisher/Course Migrator

Works with existing course materials to prepare them for use in print and online. This can include some modifications to make the course materials more interactive. This may also include migrating the courses from one online platform to the iTEE University Moodle platform.

Funding Development Administrator

Uses funding development tools and practices to acquire the necessary funding to adequately support the ministry of iTEE Global. This person will write grant/funding proposals, and develop relationships with foundations and churches to help them catch the vision of iTEE Global's ministry. This person also trains iTEE Global staff members on how to raise their own personal support.
